

Prosecutor of Marathon Bomber Joins Boston Law Firm Boston Business Journal Don Seiffert November 12, 2024 [Link]



The former assistant U.S. attorney who won a conviction of the Boston Marathon bomber has joined the Boston office of national law firm Saul Ewing.

Aloke Chakravarty was among the team of lawyers at the U.S. Attorney's office in Boston in 2015 who successfully argued for the conviction of Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, who was found guilty of setting off a bomb at the finish line of the Boston Marathon in 2013, killing three people and injuring hundreds. Chakravarty gave the closing argument at the trial.

Although an appeals court <u>ordered the case back</u> to the lower court this year to investigate claims of juror bias, and to determine whether his death sentence should stand, Tsarnaev's <u>conviction on 30 charges</u> will stand.

Chakravarty has more than two decades of experience as a state, federal and international prosecutor and trial lawyer. Most recently, he was co-chair of

Snell & Wilmer's white-collar defense and investigations practice group.

He will join Saul Ewing as a partner in the firm's practices in white-collar law, government enforcement, cybersecurity and data privacy.

Saul Ewing was founded in Philadelphia in 1921 and entered the Boston market in 2011 through <u>a merger with Dionne & Gass LLP</u>. Today Saul Ewing has more than 450 attorneys and is an AmLaw 200 law firm.
