<u>Saul Ewing LLP</u> appointed a longtime firm attorney as chair of the corporate practice, according to a Friday announcement.

Partner Rick Carroll, a Delaware-based attorney who has been with the firm for more than 12 years, will chair Saul Ewing's corporate practice, the firm announced. He was previously vice chair of the practice alongside Dennis Brennan, who remains in the role.

Carroll is admitted to the bar in New York, Pennsylvania and Delaware. He serves as Delaware trustee for state statuary trusts and frequently acts as local counsel there on complex commercial transactions for clients worldwide.
