

Saul Ewing Enters Georgia With 5-Atty Atlanta Office

Law360 (September 15, 2026, 4:09 PM EDT) -- Saul Ewing LLP announced Tuesday that the firm has officially launched a five-lawyer office in Atlanta with a mix of new hires and attorneys relocated from existing offices.

Partners Steven C. Reingold and Patrick S. Tracey moved to Atlanta from Saul Ewing's Boston office, while partner G. Scott Rafshoon joined from Squire Patton Boggs LLP, partner Peter N. Hall joined from Holland & Knight LLP and partner Rebecca Davis joined from Arnall Golden Gregory LLP, the firm said.

Reingold, who was named Atlanta managing partner, told Law360 Pulse in an emailed statement that the decision to open a physical office in the Georgia capital is part of Saul Ewing's efforts to expand upon the work the firm has already been doing in the market.

"Our goal is to grow thoughtfully by bringing in talented attorneys with deep ties to the Atlanta business community, while continuing to strengthen relationships with the clients we already serve here," he said. "We want to build an office that reflects the best of Saul Ewing, with sophisticated legal capabilities, a collaborative culture and a real understanding of the businesses and industries driving growth across Atlanta and the Southeast."

Firm managing partner Jason M. St. John added in a statement that the opening of an Atlanta office allows for Saul Ewing to better serve clients in a number of areas such as energy, financial services, higher education, life sciences, private equity, real estate development, technology and high growth middle market businesses.

"Our clients are investing, expanding, hiring, and building in Atlanta, and they need a firm that understands the business landscape and can support complex matters across these sectors," St. John said. "Establishing a presence here strengthens our ability to serve existing clients and positions us to grow with the companies driving Atlanta's booming economy."

Reingold has been with Saul Ewing since 2017. The graduate of Boston University School of Law focuses his practice on corporate matters, representing companies and related individuals in a wide range of litigation matters while also bringing experience working on bankruptcy and immigration, the firm's website said.

Tracey graduated from Suffolk University Law School and has been with Saul Ewing since 2023. His practice focuses on consumer financial services, working with industry clients on litigation, regulatory and cybersecurity matters, according to the firm's website.

Rafshoon joined Saul Ewing in June after a seven-year stint with Squire Patton, according to his LinkedIn page. A graduate of Emory University

School of Law, he primarily works on public-private partnerships with a focus on P3 military housing projects, the firm said.

Hall also joined Saul Ewing in June after spending the last six and a half years with Holland & Knight, his LinkedIn page said. He graduated from Vanderbilt Law School and the firm said that he focuses his practice on labor and employment litigation.

Davis spent three years with Arnall Golden before joining Saul Ewing in June, according to her LinkedIn profile. She graduated from Georgia State University College of Law and focuses her practice on environmental law, public finance and economic development and complex litigation, the firm said.

"Our growth strategy is about entering markets where our clients are doing business and where our collaborative culture can thrive," St. John said. "Atlanta gives us the ability to work with highly respected attorneys who have strong ties to the business community while giving clients access to Saul Ewing's national platform and the full depth of our legal capabilities."

Saul Ewing said that the firm plans to hire additional attorneys in Atlanta, highlighting its 13 years working with Georgia-based financial advisory firm Nysa Capital on over \$500 million in transactions as an example of client demand for a local presence in the city.

"Establishing an Atlanta office brings that depth of experience directly into our home market," Nysa Capital managing partner Dave Rocker said in a statement. "We are excited to see Saul Ewing make this commitment to Atlanta and look forward to building upon a relationship that has served us extraordinarily well."

Saul Ewing currently has over 450 attorneys across 19 nationwide offices, the firm's website said.
